

Romania - Bine Ati Venit! (Welcome)

Romania has a population of approximately 23 million people. Romania's 91,699 square miles are nestled between the borders of Hungary to the northwest, Yugoslavia to the southwest, Bulgaria on the south, Black Sea in the southeast, Moldova in the northeast, and the Ukraine in the north. Bucharest, the capital, is the largest city in Romania.

Christianity in Romania dates back to the early 1800s. Many cathedrals circa 18th and 19th century testify to the rich religious heritage of the country. While many Christian denominations can be found in Romania, the Romanian Orthodox Church is the primary religion.

Historically, the Romanian family has been a strong presence in the country with extended families living in close proximity to the nuclear units. Education has a high priority in the culture. There are universities in the Romanian cities of Brasov, Bucharest, Cluj, Craiova, and Timisoara.

In December, 1989, in Timisoara, Romania, civil disobedience resulted in revolution against the regime of Dictator Nicolae Ceausesucu. He was summarily deposed and executed along with his wife. Under Ceausesucu's rule the country had been brought to the brink of bankruptcy. <u>In addition, many families who had complied with the government mandate to have five children per family found they were unable to care for the children. The government's response was to have the families turn the children over to state run orphanages.</u>

Since the revolution, the Romanian economy has struggled to transition to a market-based economy. Privatization of state run institutions has been slow and corruption has been a problem. <u>Thus, the number of children in the orphanages has steadily increased</u> <u>over the past five years.</u> At present there is a current government initiative to close all the orphanages by 2007. Romania has a constitution, which was founded in 1991 and is governed by a parliamentary republic. The president is elected by majority vote and serves a fouryear term. The president appoints the Prime Minister, who in turn, appoints the cabinet. The country has 40 administrative districts.

The Romanians have a proud heritage. Among their legacy are some of these great names: Composer George Enescu; Sculptor Constantin Brancusi; Playwright Eugene Ionesco; Gymnast Nadia Comaneci; and Tennis Player Ilie Nastase.
